The following explains some of the support being introduced by the government which may be of interest.

Increasing data allowances on mobile devices to support disadvantaged children

Schools can now request help to increase mobile data allowances for children and young people who:

- Do not have fixed broadband at home
- Cannot afford additional data for their devices

We can also make requests for children who cannot attend school face-to-face because they are clinically extremely vulnerable or restrictions prevent them from going to school. If increasing mobile data isn't a suitable option for some children, schools can also request 4G wireless routers.

Access to remote learning via games consoles

Children are able to use an Xbox or Playstation games console instead of a laptop or tablet to access online schooling such as MS Teams or Google Classroom. You can do this on the following devices:

Xbox One, Xbox Series S, Xbox Series X, PlayStation 4, PlayStation 4 Pro or PlayStation 5

You will just need a USB Keyboard to plug into that device to enable this function. It just needs to be a working USB keyboard.
