Dear Parents/ Carers

What a year we've all had! We've got through these most challenging times because we are such a supportive whole school community who genuinely care about each other. As we come to the end of another school year living with covid, we can't thank you enough for your trust in us, your support and your kindness.

Looking forward there is hope for getting back to a sense of normality and leading our lives with less worry and restrictions. Along with that, the guidance for schools from September has been changed.

What has changed?

- 'Bubbles' of children can mix and there is no requirement to keep equipment and resources separate for each bubble.
- We can have assemblies, visits and visitors in to school for events -within the controls of our risk assessment.
- From 16th August there will be no requirement for children under 18 to isolate following contact with someone who tests positive; instead of isolation children who are contacts should have a PCR and then only isolate if this is positive (Further information attached about contact tracing and requirements and more to follow in September).

The school will continue to have an outbreak management plan in place and there will continue to be a requirement for enhanced hygiene, regular handwashing and cleaning and good ventilation.

What will we be keeping?

The car park drop-off and pick up arrangement has resulted in less anxiety about availability of spaces and uncongested roads outside the school; feedback is that continuing this in a similar form would be preferable. We understand that the drawback is that there is less time for a catch up with friends in the morning or after school or indeed meeting new people for those new to the school. We will look at possible ways of offering some regular social time, perhaps straight after drop off, with the help of the PTFA.

Please see the attached arrangements which we can trial for the Autumn term.

Wearing PE clothes in to school for PE days.

This seems to be popular with parents as there is less uniform needed and fewer disappearing items of clothing. For the school it has given us much needed space in the corridors and room on pegs for children to hang their coats and book bags. They will also have more PE time especially in the younger years where changing can be a challenge.

What will we be changing?

• Playtimes and lunchtimes will see children able to mix but also retain some time just with their own class. We will re-introduce our playground ambassadors whereby the older children support the younger children in the dinner hall and with their play.



- Children will no longer have to sit in rows facing front and will be able to work as groups too if this is decided as the best option.
- We will be having our daily whole school assemblies and we can sing together again!
- Our calendar of yearly events, visits and visitors will be planned for resuming.
- School council will be having their regular meetings and will be sharing their ideas for school improvement.

School organisation

- The Reception children will move back into the EYFS classroom and the hall will be used as before for assemblies, sport if wet weather, performances and class assemblies, smiley club and as an additional learning space.
- Year 5/6 will be moving into the middle classroom and Year 3 /4 into the classroom nearer the front entrance. This is to support the different learning needs of the cohorts.
- We are re-naming our classes so that there is less room for confusion between Year 1 and class 1 etc. We have chosen British birds to reflect our love of nature and the school setting.
