How are we keeping safe?

As a school community we need to continue to remain cautious. There are control measures which schools are continuing to follow and these form part of our whole school covid risk assessment. Hand hygiene, enhanced cleaning routines and good ventilation continue to be in place. We are also restricting the numbers of visitors into the school and when they can be on site. In line with DFE advice, we have developed an outbreak management plan which we will share with you. This explains the measures the school may need to introduce (following guidance from PHE) in the event of several confirmed cases in the school community. The guidance about isolation and close contacts has also changed since the end of the summer term. Please see the attached information sheet for what to do in case of your child developing symptoms.

Curriculum

Essex Music Service have an excellent programme for schools. In the past whole classes have learnt the clarinet, ukulele and recorder. Individual music lessons will also be starting and those of you that have signed up for these should have been contacted about these by the music service.
