Call of Duty

It is important to remember that Call of Duty has a PEGI rating of age 18. This also needs to be considered when older siblings are playing the game as we have had children being exposed to inappropriate content this way. Depictions of "gross violence, apparently motiveless killing, or violence towards defenceless characters" is the warning from PEGI. Most COD players are also likely to spend the majority of their time on an online multiplayer mode. This means they will be playing with or competing against strangers. Communication through the game's voice chat and direct messaging often turns heated and aggressive, which may upset younger players. It is also based around levelling up and is designed to see an improvement quickly, this means it can also be highly addictive.
