Staying safe online

The CEOP website has provided a series of three animations that aim

to give children the knowledge, skills and confidence to help them

respond safely to risks they may encounter online. The Jessie &

Friends animations are age-appropriate and do not depict any

situations where adults communicate with children online. Instead,

they show safe, non-scary situations which help young viewers

identify things which might worry them online. In this way young

viewers learn how to identify online behaviour which is 'not right', and how to get help by telling an adult they trust. This learning will

help keep them safe from many risky situations which they may

encounter online.

Carpark Reminders

No children should be dropped off and wait outside the school gates in the morning- a parent/ carer MUST be with them at all times for safeguarding purposes. Children should also be escorted into the school office if they are late.
