### The 2 Johns Online Safety in School

As part of our links with the Tiptree and Stanway Consortium, the children joined other local schools online this week for live lessons run by '<u>The 2 Johns</u>'. Here is a summary from each class about their learning. This is also a reminder that the parent session is on Tuesday 13th June. I urge you to join as there are many new risks with children's increased use of unsupervised time online.

#### Robins (Ben and Shyla)

We learnt about keeping safe online. If someone is asking online about your name or school then you should not give it. If you're scared or sad about something you should tell your mum or dad, or a teacher. You might see TikTok videos that are scary, like people fighting or a horror film. On Roblox, you can play multiplayer and chat with strangers and so you need to be very careful.

#### Kingfishers (Agatha and Margot)

We learnt a story about playing on a street corner, and there's a man with a van who has sweets. You should never accept the sweets from strangers, or any gifts as it's not safe and you might get taken. You shouldn't chat to people that you don't know in games online as they might be unkind. Stay away from Youtube and TikTok unless you're of the right age. You might see things that make you feel upset or worried. It's important to tell an adult if you feel upset or worried.

#### Owls (Cody and Erin)

The 2 Johns showed a video about bullying. Online, it's much easier for people to bully others because they don't know the other person, and feel braver to say unkind things.

On general games or apps or social media, you should check your privacy settings. There are ways that people can easily check and find your location, which isn't safe. Quick Add is a feature on Snapchat that is recommended to be turned off as it makes your account easily discoverable.

On Youtube, there are so many fake videos and giveaways. This can mean that people interact because they want the prizes, but the challenges are really not safe and you could become seriously harmed. We also got told about Omegle which is a website for live video and chats. There could be really upsetting content to see and some Youtubers use the site. Challenges are sometimes given and there are forfeits if you fail, such as taking off an item of clothing. This is a serious risk for children.

We won the quiz, which was great, but it was all about Youtube stars and as a class we knew a lot. So on reflection, maybe we watch too much Youtube as a group.

It is really very shocking for the ways some of these sites are being used to target children. Year 5 and 6 learnt about the risks in using Omegle.
