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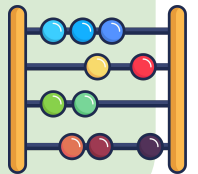
**PHONICS:**

Ensure the newly introduced Twinkl Phonics scheme is effectively embedded across the school.



**MATHS:**

To develop a progressive maths curriculum suitable for all learners where expected progress is evident and the expectations are shared with parents.



**GOVERNANCE:**

To develop areas of focus for governor monitoring visits based on the School's Development Plan that can hold the school to account.



**PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT AND WELLBEING:**
