Clarice Cliff

This term in art, Owl's Class have been studying the work of Clarice Cliff. She is a world-renowned painter of pottery from a period in history where very few women were able to reach such heights of responsibility. She started work, in 1912, when she was just thirteen years old. In the 1930s, Clarice Cliff started work on her 'Citrus' design which is the stimulus for our work.

For the first part of our work, we were each given a slice of a citrus fruit to sketch. Next, we painted a version using acrylic paints (which we gave a black outline to) and then created two more versions using watercolours and oil pastels.

We really like the bright colours she used in her work and how she uses very simple shapes so effectively. Her work makes us smile. '...having a little fun at my work does not make me any less of an artist'.

The next part of our art project was to make a bowl for our designs to be painted on to. We used water-activated sticky paper, around a mould, which when dry would produce a bowl of our own. Our bowls are now complete and ready for us to design and paint. Watch this space...




Agents of Change
