Dear Parents/ Carers,

Happy New Year and welcome back. I hope that you had a restful break over the Christmas period. It's been straight back into learning, with all classes beginning their new topics. Children in Robin class have been very excited to tell me their fantastic questions they are hoping to answer all about dinosaurs. Attendance to Celebrate!

Each term we celebrate individual attendance successes and before Christmas was no different. However, I am very happy to share that our whole school attendance is the best we have seen at Messing for a number of years. We are currently at 96.6% which compares to 94.8% nationally. Furthermore, nearly half of the children in the school (48%) have an attendance record of 99%+ which is fantastic.
