Christmas at Messing

Christmas time in school is wonderful as we share the magic of the season with all of the children. We know that at home many children are starting the day with high energy due to the excitement of chocolate advent calendars and elves causing mischief. Nativity Tickets

We are aware that the arrangements for this year's nativity are very different from previous years. The reason for the change in ticket allocation for the nativity is necessary to ensure that we are compliant with health and safety regulations. Unlike previous years, we do not have a significant sibling overlap in KS1 this year, and with all children attending, allowing each child to have two people in the audience, coupled with the number of staff required to support the nativity, would mean that the hall had to accommodate over 120 people. This is both unsafe and impractical.

We have considered all the alternatives for increasing audience size this year, and made some enquiries about using another venue, however nothing proved to be financially, practically or logically viable. We will, of course, continue to consider whether there are any solutions to this next year.

As I mentioned in my original letter, we have a small number of spare tickets for each performance, these will be allocated on a first come first served basis. If you are unable to use your ticket to one or both performances, please return these to the office so that we are able to re-allocate them.
